Election News from the Past

In 1912, eight years ahead of the national as a whole, Kansas voted to give women full voting rights, equal to men. Kansas had been progressive on women's suffrage, giving women voting rights in school elections in 1861 and for municipal elections in 1887. Women in Kansas had always campaigned for their right to vote, starting before Kansas was a state, but on Nov. 5, 1912 the male voters of the state approved the amendment.

We offer a sampling of local Jefferson County newspaper articles from those times.

"A Suffrage automobile will leave Topeka on Monday, October 7 and stop in Winchester some time during that day. Miss Clay, grand-daugher of Henry Clay, is the speaker. She is accompanied by other famous women." – *The Winchester Star*, 4 Oct 1912.

"Saturday afternoon Perry heard its first Woman Suffrage orators of the present campaign, when Mrs. J.W. Thurston and Mrs. S.J. Brandenburg of Topeka addressed the voters of Perry and surrounding community from an automobile on Front Street. Mrs. Brandenburg was the first speaker and dwelt at some length on the reasons why the fair sex should have the right of suffrage, stating in brief that the women pay taxes, obey the laws, suffer from bad government, and that they are consumers and consumers need fuller representation in politics, women are citizens of a government OF the people, BY the people and FOR the people, and WOMEN ARE PEOPLE and should vote equally with men. Mrs. Thurston followed with a good sensible speech outlining the reasons for Woman's Suffrage, saying that the fight for the ballot was being waged

by some of the best women of the state, who were mothers of large families, and were not into the scuffle for the sake of individual gain, but for the betterment of womanhood at large, whether rich or poor, strong or weak. *Perry Mirror*, 24 Oct 1912.

"Jefferson County Suffrage Happenings President Mrs. A.M. Keener of Valley Falls. This president having finished stacking of 30 tons of hay on her farm, is devoting most of her time to the campaign. Meetings were held in Valley Falls by Mrs. Lucy B. Johnston and her speakers before Oct. 10. Perry had its first suffrage meeting Oct. 19, the speakers being Mrs. J.W. Thurston, treasurer of the state association, and Mrs. S.J. Brandenburg. The Good Government Club of Topeka arranged the meeting at Grantville October 21 held in the hall furnished by Chas. Kleinhans, Mrs. Lucia O. Case and Dr. E.S. Petty john were the speakers, and Mrs. Isabel McArthur gave readings. On Oct. 21 Mrs. Lilla Day Monroe gave the an address on the history of woman suffrage and its value to the mother, under the auspices of the Perry High School Literary Society and on Tuesday morning Prof. J.B. Harbeson invited her to use the chapel period talking to the entire school on the economic value of suffrage to the working woman." – The

Edwin Snyder of Topeka wrote at length in the Oct. 11, 1912, edition of *The Oskaloosa Independent* favoring woman suffrage, although he did so also by taking a swipe at 'foreigners.' "I say let the women vote... Only about five per cent of the population of our penitentiary is women. They support our churches and private charitable institutions. Their influence is for good in every walk of life. It will be so in politics when they are enfranchised."

Perry Mirror, 31 Oct. 1912.

F.H. Roberts, son of the newspaper's 1860 founder J.W. Roberts, appears to have softened the family line on woman's suffrage (the elder Roberts was violently opposed) but wrote: "We know numbers of women in this and other communities who are far more strongly opposed to it than any men we know. And they are club women and literary women, too, among the most capable of the sex to cast an intelligent ballot. They say they don't want this extra responsibility, and that the men voters here in Kansas have done all in the way of legislative and government that the women could have done if they had the ballot."

The amendment passed in Kansas and *The Eastern Kansan* (Valley Falls) on 28 Nov. 1912 said this:

"WOMEN GET REVENGE. With a bonfire of copies of the November 1 edition of the Ladies Home Journal the 20 officers of the Johnson County Suffrage association celebrated their victory at Olathe. The publication was selected for fuel because it contained an article by Edward W. Bok criticizing women voters"

Jefferson County **rejected** the amendment, however, with 1,850 voting against women voting, and 1,824 favoring it. Many argued that the liquor industry campaigned against women voting, drawing a biting comment or two from the W.C.T.U. of Winchester. The anti-liquor group wrote in *The Winchester Star* weeks after the election that Jefferson County's male voters must liken women to "criminals and idiots." "If we remember correctly in 1880 the prohibition vote lost in this same county. We are not all Kansans if we do think so."

OSKALOOSA CUB REPORTER

NOTE: The following school records come from an unusual source. They are from The "Cub Reporter," the news published by the Oskaloosa High School students of 1952-53. THE OLDEST COLORED RESIDENT

The Perry Mirror, Aug. 23, 1898

"Down in Western Kentucky there was born a colored girl baby 106 years ago, and that baby now feeble, blind and old, lives in Perry, Kansas. She is Mrs. Susan Bryant and lives with Mrs. Henry Andrews, her daughter. She left Kentucky at an early age and lived in Clay County, Mo., then came to Kansas, locating in Douglas County and from there to Jefferson county and has resided here for about 38 years. From her has descended representatives in nearly every colored family in Perry, in fact it is said she is related to all of them except the Lees and Asburys. She is a devout Christian and a firm believer in God and everything He does, and her declining days are passing peacefully and quietly."

[NOTE: We find that Susan (Austin) Bryant's death is reported in The Perry Mirror April 1901, age 106. There is also another entry in the death records with birth 1895 and death __ Dec. 1900, although we have found no source for the December death. The Kansas State Census of 1865 shows Mrs. Bryant (widowed) living in the Lecompton area with family. By 1875 she and her family had moved to Kentucky township in Jefferson County and she remained in Jefferson County, according to census material, until her death.]

HENRY BRYANT

The Perry Mirror, July 28, 1898

"Ode of the old colored residents of Perry is dead. The familiar figure of Henry Bryant will be seen no more. His cheery voice and generous good nature will not be enjoyed by his friends in this world again. He has succumbed to that summons from which no one can turn aside. He was sick but a short time with inflammation of the bowels and at 10:00 o'clock Friday morning July 22d he died surrounded a portion of his family at his home on the hill just north of town where he has lived all these years.

Henry Bryant was born in Clay County, Mo. over 58 years ago of slave parents and lived with them until he was 20 years of age. When he with his young wife departed from their home in Clay County for the purpose of seeking a place where all men who obey the law might be free, and settled in Douglas County. He was thus deprived in his youth of an education thereby placing him in an awkward position to make a living yet during a residence of over 38 years in Kansas, 38 years of which has been passed on the home place near Perry he has made himself an honorable name and laid up a comfortable competence and has proven himself to be an honorable and respected neighbor, good friend and highly esteemed by all and will be greatly missed

He leaves a wife and 10 children to mourn his loss, besides numerous relatives in and around Perry. The deceased had been a member of the Baptist church for twenty years and the pastor, Rev. A. L. Voorhies conducted the funeral services at the house on Sunday at 4:00 p.m. and all that remained of Henry Bryant was laid to rest in Oak Ridge Cemetery was followed there by a large concourse of sympathizing friends and neighbors."

[NOTE: Data from ancestry.com, including information from relatives and state and U.S. censuses, indicate Henry Bryant's mother was Susan (Austin) Bryant, profiled briefly in the item previous to this one.]

RAINES FAMILY REUNION

The Perry Mirror, July 14, 1898, page 4

"An eventful family reunion took place at the home of Mr. and Mrs. H. C. Raines. All of the children of Father and Mother Raines consisting of eight boys and two girls were gathered together for the first time since June 1885, thirteen years ago.

This reunion was made especially pleasant by the presence of one son J. W. who with his estimable wife and two sons, now reside in San Jose, Cal. All of the children are married, each wife and husband was present at this reunion, and all reside in Jefferson county, Kansas, except for J. W., who lives in California and D. W., who is pastor of the Michigan Avenue.M. E. church, Leavenworth, Kansas. Five of the family are members of the Methodist, three of the Presbyterian and one of the U. B. church.

Father and mother Raines moved to Jefferson County, Kansas, from Mills county, Iowa, in 1866, and have resided in this county continually since that time. They have seen their large family of children grow up to manhood and womanhood and leave them one by one until now they are left alone.

On Tuesday, June 28th J. W. and family started back to their California home, leaving many remembrances of their visit with us, and a prayer for their safe return home, to the father and mother whose years are beginning to weigh heavily upon them. The children all unite in an earnest prayer that the remaining days of their lives may be full of peace, comfort and happiness and if not another reunion on earth that it might be a grand reunion in that land where we shall know as we are known. ---ONE OF THE FAMILY"

The 1861 rolls present differences from the territorial rolls of 1858 and 1859. One is the 1861 inclusion of a 50-cent poll tax, a tax that had to be paid before (white male) voters could vote in elections. The few women property holders on the tax rolls were not charged a poll tax in 1861. Women could not vote in Kansas, at that time, except in school-related elections.
